Steam Rally: 28th and 29th May 2023 – in need of volunteers and stewards for the event in Bailey Park.

Abergavenny Arts Festival – 17th June 2023: Smaller scale event this year due to changes on their board, but hope to come back with larger event in 2024.

Sanctuary Project – 19th – 24th June 2023 inc. performances in the Borough Theatre $21^{st} - 24^{th}$ June 2023. Vic Mills from Contemorancient Theatre is working with the Plas Gunter Mansion on a project called Sanctuary, holding workshops, and community/school performances. There is a Welsh/Syrian Score for the show that is due to be performed at the Borough Theatre $21^{st} - 24^{th}$ June. Worked with refugees in Newport and Cardiff, in conjunction with the Abergavenny Town Of Sanctuary. Need 10 adults to help with the spoken word element of the play, if anyone has any links please contact the Town Clerk at Abergavenny Town Council and details can be forwarded on from there.

Abergavenny Pride – Saturday 24th June 2023: Aaron and Jo explained there are plans for a parade to walk through town between 10am – 12pm, to lead into the Family Fun Day at the Priory until 5pm.

The evening will see an 18+ event for up to 500 in the Prince of Wales Courtyard. Looking to see if MCC would be willing to allow the zebra crossing to be decorated in rainbow colours for the event. Town Clerk to make contact with MCC Highways and Car Parks to see if there is any possibility of this. There is scope to link in to Think Space Talks – Queer History Art & Culture to continue through the year.

Armed Forces Day – Saturday 24th June 2023: Peter Farthing form the Abergavenny Branch Royal British Legion and Veterans Hub explained this year's event is being held in Newport, but there is talk of Abergavenny applying to hold this in 2025.

Abergavenny In Bloom judging for Wales In Bloom – Mid-July 2023: Abergavenny is representing Wales in Britain In Bloom this year, with the first round of judging in July. This year's Theme is 75th Birthday of the NHS, so something to mark this on 5th July 2023 will be planned. Businesses and organisations will be asked to join in by decorating their windows and public areas in rainbow colours, so it may be an idea to do this for Pride on 24th June, then tweak the displays for the NHS celebrations on 5th July, leaving them in place until the judging has taken place mid-July. Britain In Bloom judging will then take place first 10 days of August, so the display windows in the High Street will be utilised to showcase the 'celebrations' held.

Outdoor Theatre Events – 4th, 12th and 17th August 2023, Abergavenny Castle

Remembrance Parade – Sunday 12th November 2023: ATC and RBL are already organising this year's parade due to the high number of participants. We need more trained marshals to assist with safely stewarding the route of the parade, so ATC will ask MCC if they intend to run their Marshalling Course again in the next few months.

Christmas Light Switch On – Saturday 18th November 2023: ATC are proposing to run a similar event to the 2022 switch on across town at several locations. The date has been pencilled in, as we need to be better prepared due to the high numbers of people that attended. Again, more marshals are needed to be able to safely steward the route. The light-up reindeer is not returning, but alternative ideas are being looked at to encourage community engagement – something like a lantern parade with workshops leading up to the date, or tree decorations with nominated 'trees' for people to decorate.
