-safeguard principal species and habitats	Abergavenny Town Council is in discussion with Monmouthshire County Council regarding the role of the Town Council in the implementation of the Green Infrastructure Strategy with the town. This will include the Gavenny river corridor and Castle Meadows area which is a floodplain for the river Usk. Through partnership working, the Town Council has contributed to the management of protected sites and species, including Local Wildlife Sites. How and when will the s6 duty be monitored and the s6 plan reviewed?

- The duty will be monitored through progress reports on the 'Protect and Enhance the Environment' action table which forms part of the overall Strategy & Action Plan. Progress is reported each month to the Environment Committee.
- In April 2020, there will be a full revision of the Town Council's Strategy & Action Plan and at this time the Strategy will be strengthened to reflect actions under Section 6 under the Environment (Wales) Act 2016.
