Vision/Objectives?	The <u>Council's Strategy &amp; Action Plan</u> and contained within is a clear mission statement "Working for and with the people and communities of Abergavenny".
	The Town Council has used the four Monmouthshire PSB Wellbeing Objectives to structure their strategy together with an additional priority area concerned with changes to the operation of the Town Council.
	Councillors receive regular updates on progress against the action plan and revised the Strategy and Action Plan in December 2020.

Long Term The importance of balancing short-term needs with the need to safeguard the ability to also meet long-term needs.	The Council signed a further partnering agreement with external organisation Mind Monmouthshire. This agreement offers Mind Monmouthshire the security of multi-year funding in return for delivery of outcomes against the four PSB wellbeing objectives.
	Prevention How acting to prevent problems occurring or getting worse may help public bodies meet their objectives.	The Council has made good progress engaging with a range of organisations and MCC departments to understand issues affecting Abergavenny. This can result in the Town Council funding different activities which can prevent problems occurring or getting worse. The Town Council very much considers itself part of the solutions to many of the issues faced by residents and businesses in the town.
	Integration Considering how the public body's well-being objectives may impact upon each of the well-being goals, on their other objectives, or on the objectives of other public bodies.	The Town Council continues to work closely with many organisations to deliver its actions, particularly with MCC.
	Collaboration Acting in collaboration with any other person (or different parts of the body itself) that could help the body to meet its well-being objectives.	The Town Council continues to have limited human and financial resources so seeks to collaborate with other organisations wherever possible to enable the Town Council to meet its wellbeing objectives.  It has collaborated well with MCC Grounds Team on a project to enhance biodiversity in the town. The Town Council provided the funding for the plants and engaged a landscape designer with MCC providing the team to undertake the clearance of the old planting and planting of new.  The Town Council has also commenced discussions with MCC
		Grounds Team with the aim of setting up a small team dedicated to improving the streetscene in Abergavenny. Monmouthshire CC would employ this team with their work schedule determined collaboratively.

#### Involvement

The Town Council continues to reach out to the community through improved communication. The Town Council writes a regular column in the Abergavenny Chronicle covering the work of the Town Council, activities taking place in the town, volunteer opportunities as well as requesting feedback on specific issues. The Town Council has an active Facebook page which is regularly updated as is the website. During 2020-21 the Town Council conducted a survey to find out more about people's vegetable & fruit growing habits to inform future provision. It has not been possible to hold events or other physical engagement activities in 2020-21.

To support community organisations that offer activities for all generations and offer a supportive and welcoming environment	The Town Council's multi-year funding agreement with Abergavenny Community Trust contributes to staffing and running costs which enabled the community centre to run a limited programme of activities including subsidised lunches and coffee mornings when covid restrictions eased in the summer/early Autumn.  Abergavenny Town Council supports Abergavenny Community Enterprise Partnership which offers support and advice to residents, particularly those living in north Abergavenny

To introduce and pilot Adopt A Garden scheme in Abergavenny	Development work is underway to ensure all the backroom processes are in place. Promoted through the Our Monmouthshire platform, adopt a garden matches would-be gardeners with people who own too much garden, preferably living close to each other. The garden owner allows the gardener to use a part of their garden to grow food or flowers, and in return, that part of their garden is cared for. This takes away the worry and anxiety from not being able to manage the gardening.  The gardener may wish to share some of their produce with the owner, or help to keep another part of the garden looking nice, but this is not a condition of the scheme. It is anticipated that friendships will develop, often across generations, between predominantly younger gardeners and older owners.

To set up an Abergavenny Town Centre Action Group	No progress in 2020
To contribute towards an economically thriving town centre	The Town Council encourages tourism through its many actions, namely financial support of the Tourist Information Centre, contributing towards the Visit Abergavenny publication, staging of free events, Christmas Lights and the associated switch on event, financial support for the various festivals held in the town. In 2020-21, a new Christmas Lighting scheme was introduced with a virtual switch on. Only two of the many town festivals supported by the Town Council went ahead on a virtual platform.
	The Town Council also provides services which create a more pleasant and accessible town centre, namely a significant contribution to MCC to provide public toilets, street cleaning and CCTV and all year round planting and maintenance of the permanent town centre planters.
	The Town Council contributed to the new fixtures and fittings for the Tourist Information Centre when relocating to the Town Hall.
	The Town Council contributed towards the painting of the exterior woodwork at the Town hall following an extensive internal refurbishment.

To increase the use of pollinator friendly planting in the town centre planters	The Town Council was successful in its application for Local Places for Nature funding. This has enabled 2 large beds to be replanted with pollinator friendly planting, 30 bird boxes to be made by school children and installed in the town, production of a biodiversity trail and leaflet, planting of a wildlife corridor on Castle Meadows	
To support volunteer groups that contribute to the upkeep of the town parks	The Town Council has agreed a budget for multi year funding to enhance the work of the volunteer groups that contribute to the upkeep of the town greenspaces. This will enable them to plan their work programme with more certainty.	
To create new habitats by replanting areas of town where the current planting is poor and of little value for biodiversity	The first phase of replanting was carried out in 2020-21 in collaboration with Monmouthshire County council. Further planting will be carried out in Autumn 2021.	
To prepare a report setting out how the Town Council is meeting its obligations under Section 6 of the Environment (Wales) Act	Report prepared and uploaded to the Town Council's website. Further information is included in the Council's Annual report delivered to all households and in the Strategy & Action Plan progress report available on the Council's website. The revised Strategy & Action Plan incorporates actions to maintain, enhance and promote biodiversity.
